2009-2010 FBA Committees

Circuit Court Committee

Studies and makes recommendations relative to the procedures and operations of the Fairfax Circuit Court. Committee members are appointed by the FBA President.

Continuing Legal Education Committee

Oversees the development and execution of the FBA's CLE program to ensure the availability of a wide variety of educational programs for members of the bar.

General District Court Committee

Provides an opportunity for the Bench and Bar to exchange ideas on the most efficient operation of the Fairfax General District Court.

J&DR Court Committee

Provides assistance to the J&DR bench by acting as a conduit between the bench and practicing attorneys.

Law Library Committee

Provides insight to the Fairfax Public Law Library with regards to collection, equipment purchases, and budget requirements.

Law Related Education Committee

Promotes and organizes the bars efforts towards a better understanding of, and appreciation for, the rule of law in both youth and adults through Court Tours, the Devonshire Program, Chocolate Lovers Festival, and more.

Lawyer Referral and Information Service

Enhances the referral service's ability to serve both the public and members. Develops marketing plans to improve referrals and oversees quality control of referral panels.

Legislative Committee

Monitors, reviews, suggests, and promotes legislation in the VA General Assembly of interest to the membership.

Pro Bono Committee

Monitors and develops recommendations and programs to meet the legal needs of low income Fairfax County residents.

Technology Committee

Works with the bar to improve the bar's website, evaluate and comment on technology issues as they relate to the legal profession and the administration of justice, advise the bar on technology needs of its members and how the bar can meet those needs.
